#### DOUBLE DUAL DOMINATION:

The UIC swimming team traveled to Indianapolis on Saturday to face Horizon League rival Butler and visiting Lindenwood University. The Flames journeyed back to Chicago with convincing victories over both teams on each side, as both the UIC men and women grabbed two wins apiece in double dual meet action.

#### PIECE OF CAKE FOR BLAKE:

UIC sophomore sprint freestyler **Blake Booher (Barrington, Ill./Barrington)** continued to shine for the Flames, posting two event wins to key the men's team. Booher's day was highlighted by a career-best 20.86 in the 50 free, UIC's top time of the season in the event. The second-year phenom, coming off a great offseason in which he qualified for the U.S. Summer Nationals in the 50-meter freestyle, then went on to take first in the 100-yard freestyle, swimming a 47.39.

#### HEISMAN WORTHY IN THE POOL:

He may not be the Eddie George of football fame, but UIC's **Edi Georg (Naperville, Ill./Naperville North)** has been as clutch for his team in recent weeks as the 1995 Heisman Trophy winner was for Ohio State. This past weekend Georg posted the first two-win meet of his Flames career, leading off the men's individual slate on Saturday with a three-second victory in the 1000-yard freestyle at 10:25.10. Georg then went on to win one of his specialties, the 200 backstroke, in 2:01.08, beating out his next closest competitor by nearly four ticks. Still recovering from surgery to repair a torn meniscus, Georg now has three wins in his last two meets.

#### HARE HE GOES AGAIN:

Rookie **Dan Hare (Lockport, Ill./Lockport)** is already getting serious consideration for the league's Newcomer of the Year honor, and the season is less than a month old. The youngest of three Hare siblings on the UIC roster, Dan tallied two more event wins, swimming victorious races in the 200 IM (1:57.56) and the 500 freestyle (4:54.86). Hare would have won his third event, posting a 2:14.51 in the 200 breaststroke, had the Flames not run the last four events of the meet as exhibition swimmers because the team victory was well in hand.

#### BALANCED WOMEN'S ATTACK:

While three members of the UIC men's team tallied two wins apiece, the Flames women's team kept their performance a little more balanced. Out of the women's squad's seven individual event victories, all seven were won by a different athlete.

#### SAME RESULTS IN 50 FREE:

UIC head coach **Paul Moniak** gave **Colleen Dougherty (Woodstock, Ill./Woodstock)** a break from the 50 free by keeping her out of the race on Saturday, an event she has yet to lose during her young career. Even without Dougherty, the Flames saw a familiar result thanks to some reliable veterans. **Jenny Gessford (Decatur, Ill./St. Teresa)** took the event in 24.84, while **Kelly Hyatt (Shakopee, Minn./Shakopee)** and **Aisha Williams (Sacramento, Calif./St. Francis)** rounded out UIC's top-three finish in the event.
