Men's Soccer Wins Horizon League Tournament With 3-1 Victory Over Green Bay

Flames head to NCAA Tournament for second straight season.

Chicago, Ill. - The UIC men's soccer team punched its ticket back to the NCAA Tournament on Sunday by winning the 2007 Horizon League Tournament with a 3-1 triumph over Green Bay in the championship match at Loyola Soccer Park.

Freshman [Kevin Stoll](#), junior [Pat McMahon](#) and senior [Pavle Dundjer](#) accounted for the Flames' three goals with junior [Mike Giffin](#) tallying a pair of assists in the win.

UIC, which has won its last five decisions, will make its second straight and fourth all-time NCAA Tournament appearance when play gets underway next weekend. The Horizon League Tournament title was the team's third all-time and first since 2000.

The Flames will learn their opponent and the site of their first round game on Monday when pairings are announced at 4:30 p.m. The team will host a selection viewing party at Morgan's Bar and Grill on Halsted and Maxwell starting at 4:15 p.m.

UIC could host a first round match as Flames Field is recognized as a premier pitch that would provide an atmosphere worthy of the NCAA Tournament.

On Sunday, after both squads misfired on early opportunities, a UIC corner kick in the 39th minute led to the game's first marker. Younger won the service in the box sent in from Giffin, and the ball found its way to the boots of Stoll, who continued his magical run in the Horizon League Tournament with his third goal in as many matches.
